Curriculum Highlights

Year 5 Explore the Thames

Year 5 embarked on their River Thames trip with the Thames Explorer Trust in Chiswick. The children learnt about the history of the river Thames, how this body of water grew as one travels from source to mouth, as well as how people worked hard to bring back lost wildlife from the industrial revolution.

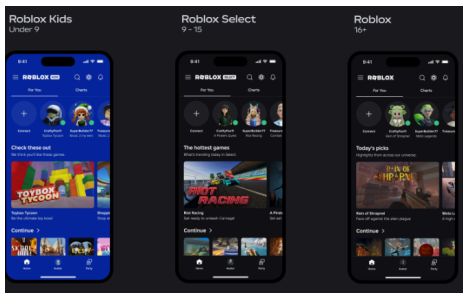
Out on the pier, the children investigated the water's temperature, PH level and noticed the human and physical features around them. Lastly, with small fishing nets, the children explored the foreshore in low tide, scavenging safely for organisms (such as crabs, leeches and shrimp) as well as gently lifting up rocks to see what lived underneath! What fun!

Roblox Kids and Roblox Select



Roblox have been making some big changes recently, and that now includes 'age-gating' so that children and young people get the experience according to their age. This means that there are now 3 types of Roblox accounts:

- Roblox Kids - for children 5-8 years.
- Roblox Select - for children 9-15 years.
- Roblox - for anyone 16+.
